Recent ICSA International Conference in New York (Fort Lee)

The most recent international conference was held in New York (Fort Lee, NJ). There were 250 people attendees from 21 countries and more than 70 presentations. Mike Kropveld, Info-Cult's Executive Director, organized and moderated three sessions on “**How to Bring About Change in Controversial Groups**”. These sessions explored how controversial groups can and do change in response to internal and external processes. Mike will continue to pursue this theme in future conferences as the idea that groups can and do change is often not considered or is rejected when focusing on “cults” and cultic groups.

Presentations

Mike Kropveld, will be travelling to Turin, Italy in September to present at a conference organized by CESNUR (Center for Studies on New Religions) entitled **“Changing Gods. Between Religion and Everyday Life”**. He will be part of a panel on **“Responses to Harm and NRMs in Europe and North America”**. His presentation, **“Cults, NRMs and Related Groups: What Governments are Asked to Do; What Governments Should Consider”** will focus on the kinds of requests that people, concerned about cult harms, have asked of governments in Europe and North America and which governmental responses are appropriate and beneficial.

In addition, over the last few months, Mike provided educational programs to high schools and community groups in and around Montreal.

NOTE : **Michael Kropveld** of Info-Cult and **Michael Langone** of ICSA were to have given talks, “Cultic Crimes in North America,” at the April 24, 2010 INFORM conference at the London School of Economics. Unfortunately, the ash cloud from the Iceland volcano prevented them from leaving North America. Fortunately, **Rod and Linda Dubrow-Marshall** two colleagues in Wales filled in for them and presented the talks at the conference.
